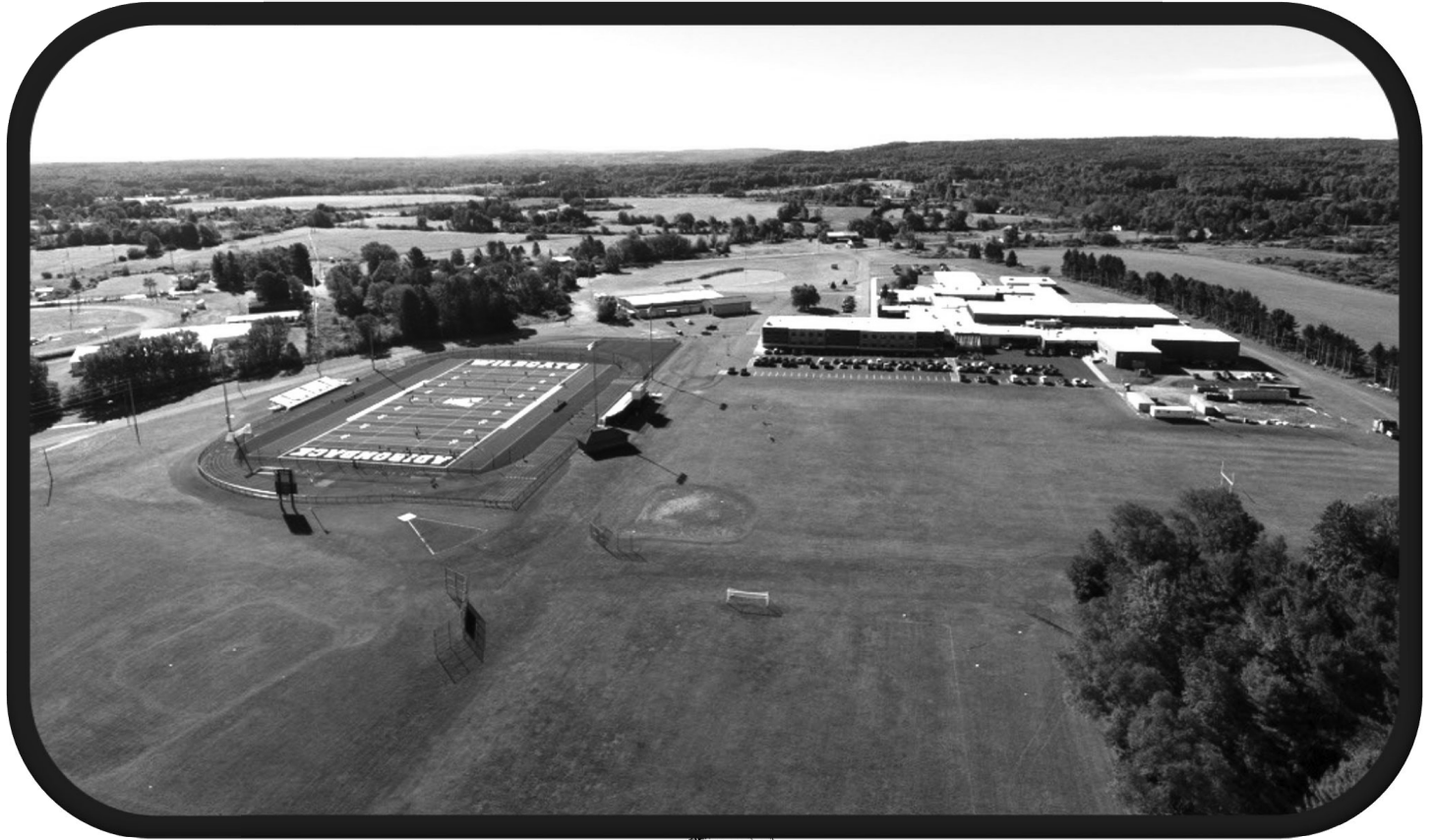

Update from Kristy McGrath, Superintendent



What's New at Adirondack

As you most likely know, New York State was awarded federal money through the ARP (American Rescue Plan) Act and CRRSA (Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations) Act. **Adirondack Central School District will receive approximately 4.5 million dollars over the next three years through this revenue source.** A survey was distributed to Adirondack stakeholders in May 2021, with 256 community members participating, to help guide our planning of this funding. In addition, a public presentation was made at the June 2021 Board meeting.

There are parameters for how this money can be spent by the district, with a focus on:

- 1-safe return to in-person learning
- 2-fill gaps due to learning loss
- 3-plan for mental health issues
- 4-ensure the health and safety of students
- 5-accommodate technology needs of students
- 6-enhance instructional program
- 7-provide additional learning opportunities (summer, after school, vacations)
- 8-be cautious of a spending cliff in 3 years when the money's gone

The district identified the following goal/focus areas:

- 1-Increase Pre-School and Early Intervention Services for Children, 3&4-Year Olds
- 2-Increase Support at Primary Grades Due to Learning Loss, K-2
- 3-Ensure a Strong Core Academic Program in ELA and Math, K-8
- 4-Increase Social/Emotional Support, UPK-12
- 5-Increase Technology and STEAM Support and Opportunities, UPK-12
- 6-Purchase STEAM/Technology, UPK-12
- 7-Create Facility for a School-Based Health Center, UPK-12
- 8-Purchase Equipment, UPK-12
- 9-Offer Summer School and After School Programming

I'm pleased to update you on a summary of some of the new and exciting things we are offering at Adirondack. Most items mentioned are paid for out of the stimulus money and do not have a cost to the district out of the general fund over the next three years. When this money expires, the district will either need to discontinue the additions, or pursue other funding sources. **It is important that our school community realizes that we will not be able to sustain all of these items once the stimulus money runs out in September of 2024.**

Here's what's new:

1-STEAM Lab and STEAM Opportunities, K-12: We are excited to have Mr. Nick Palczak in the role as District STEAM Coordinator. In addition, the district has STEAM Aides, K-5 (Brenda Dowling, Nancy Lutz, and Jamie Benson). These positions support students and staff in using cutting edge technology, mapping out the Computer Science and Digital Literacy Standards, connecting students to career opportunities in STEAM, and support overall technology integration into classrooms. In addition, the district will utilize funds to sustain our 1:1 student chromebook plan, along with adding high tech equipment such as 3d printers, laser engravers, virtual welders, virtual reality, drones, robotics, and more. We plan to pursue more STEAM clubs and extracurricular/enrichment options for our students, including FLL, Jr FLL, & FTC Teams and eSports.

2-Expanded UPK Opportunities: We have been able to make our 4 year-old UPK classrooms full-day this year, along with adding a 3 year-old full-day classroom. It was exciting to see that we had an increased interest in our UPK programs when families found out they were full day programs. Each classroom is filled to capacity with a small number of students on a waiting list. The district has also applied for a UPK Expansion Grant, so if we are awarded this, it will secure our ability to continue full-day UPK beyond the 3 years of the stimulus money. Mrs. Heather Groff is our 3 year-old teacher, Mrs. Cheri Pulquerio teaches a combination of 3 and 4 year-olds at West Leyden, Mrs. Susan Merriam is a 4 year-old UPK teacher, and Mrs. Kim Corr also teaches 4 year olds. Thank you to our UPK Aides: Patricia Winters, Kristin McIntyre, MaryBeth Korman and Sally Ortlieb.

3-Increased Mental Health Support: The district is pleased to welcome Mrs. Rhiannon Hickox, who will begin as a Social Worker, based in the Middle School, starting October 15th. Currently the district doesn't employ a Social Worker, so we are excited to welcome her to our team. In addition, we are pleased to have Ms. Joanna Dailey join us, a Behavioral Health Specialist. Joanna comes to us through a partnership with Rubenzahl-Knudsen & Associates out of Watertown, allowing families to receive therapy in the district, without needing to travel. RKA does bill to insurance, but there is no out-of-pocket cost, and this service can be accessed via self-referral, parent referral, doctor referral, and /or principal referral. No students are seen by Ms. Dailey without parental consent. For any questions, Joanna can be contacted at x 4521. She's based out of the high school and begins October 1st.

4-Added Support for Math and ELA Instruction: The district is implementing a new Math series at K-5 this year, Envisions. In addition we are providing our teachers at K-5 with training on The Science of Reading, supported by The Reading League, in Syracuse. We will be piloting and selecting a new ELA series for K-5 over the course of this year, to be in place for 2022-23. We were in need of new programs, as both that we have been using are outdated and not aligned with current standards and assessments. In addition, we have several new people who will be supporting staff members and students. Mrs. Jackie Layton is a Math Coordinator K-8. Jackie will support teachers in professional development as they implement Envisions. She will also analyze data and make recommendations on an assessment and intervention plan that is driven by student need and best practices. Finally, we have added Reading Intervention Teachers. Ms. Toni Trifeletti comes to us with many years of early intervention experience in Florida, and Mrs. Jill Bator (former West Leyden Kindergarten Teacher) is teaching AIS and Reading Intervention at West Leyden this year. The purpose of Reading Intervention is that our earliest learners missed a substantial portion of instruction during the remote period in the past year and a half. Our Reading Intervention Teachers will target our early grades to support small group instruction, based on The Science of Reading, to support early reading.

5-Summer School and Wildcat Camp: The district was able to get a summer school program operational for 2021, with hopes that it continues each summer. We are thrilled to announce that a total of 261 K-12 students participated, with 78 high schoolers earning credit for courses they would have otherwise failed. One Senior was able to receive a diploma due to courses completed in summer school. In addition, we held Wildcat Camp for our K-5th grade students, with over 160 students participating. We are hoping that the Village of Boonville will be able to resume this program in the future (Summer Rec). Between Wildcat Camp and Summer School, students were provided free breakfast and lunch, along with transportation. Students were treated to some really special presentations, such as Bubble Mania, Magic Rocks, Jeff the Magic Man, a ventriloquist, a Zoomobile, field trip to the Black River Canal Museum, Cornell Cooperative Extension "Healthy Eating," and bike safety with the Oneida County Sheriff's Department. A special thank you to our coordinators, Mrs. Dana Ely and Ms. Diane Ross, along with the many teachers, administrators, bus drivers, cafeteria staff, and camp counselors who made summer programming possible!

6-After School Program...Coming Soon (K-5): We are finalizing a partnership with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Oneida County to offer a free afterschool program at Boonville Elementary (for up to 40 students) and West Leyden Elementary (for up to 20 students). Registrations and further information should be coming soon. The program will run after school each school day, with a focus on academics and enrichment. 4-H, STEAM, cooking, recreation, and more will be included, and students will be expected to complete homework if they are behind. Transportation is provided for those who cannot accommodate parent pick-up. Ms. Marina DeAngleo is the Program Supervisor. The district contracts with Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE), and they in turn run the whole program, so any questions about the program can be directed to CCE. Again, more information will be coming soon!

7-School Based Health Center: The district is in the initial phases of planning a School-Based Health Center. Many schools across the state have this in place. The concept is that it's a doctor's office, onsite, to make access to families easier. In addition, insurance is billed, but families do not pay any co-pays or have out-of-pocket expenses. No students are seen by the center unless parents have given permission. The partnering hospital submits all paperwork and handles the staffing and day-in and day-out running of the School-Based Health Center. The school's responsibility is to provide a space that meets the requirements, and we will help to distribute information on behalf of the School-Based Health Center. At this time, a possible timeline is September 2022 to have the School-Based Health Center operational.

8-District Nurse: The school district will be able to continue to support a District Nurse with our stimulus money. During the Covid pandemic, it is invaluable to have this person available to assist with Covid education, contact tracing, and soon-to-be Covid testing. Beyond Covid, the District Nurse can help support students with medical needs on field trips, provide sub coverage for school nurses when needed, and provide education to our entire student population on topics pertaining to health and safety. We are pleased to welcome Mrs. Sandy Mercer to the District Nurse role this year, as Mrs. Mary Healt is now based in the Middle School.

9-Miscellaneous Items: We are in the process of exploring the possibility of adding intramural opportunities for our 4th-6th grade students. We will also be planning to bring back Community Education opportunities for our entire community. A goal is to provide increased access to our newly renovated pool, which will be open by mid-October, along with our gyms and weight room. All of these are in initial planning stages, but goals of the district. Stimulus money will be utilized to purchase furniture for the District Office, Middle School and High School classrooms, along with what was needed for our new UPK Rooms. The district has a back-pack program, which provides food to families, and stimulus money will support this program. Any families who would like additional information on the backpack program shall contact their school nurse or Ms. Sharon Cihocki at x1831. Thank you to Mrs. Houser's Class for organizing, packing, and distributing the backpacks. Finally, stimulus money is allotted for expanding the field trips and assemblies that we can provide to our students.

In conclusion, there are many exciting things happening and "in the works" at Adirondack. 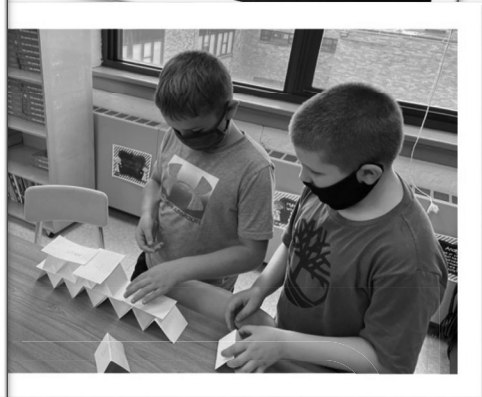

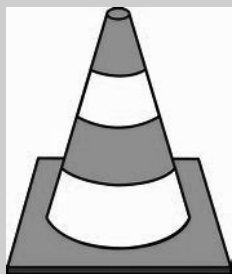

Technology, Curriculum and Instruction

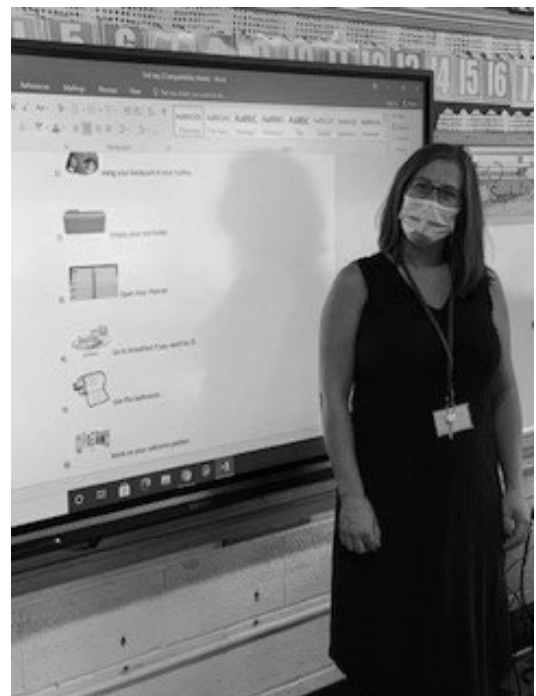
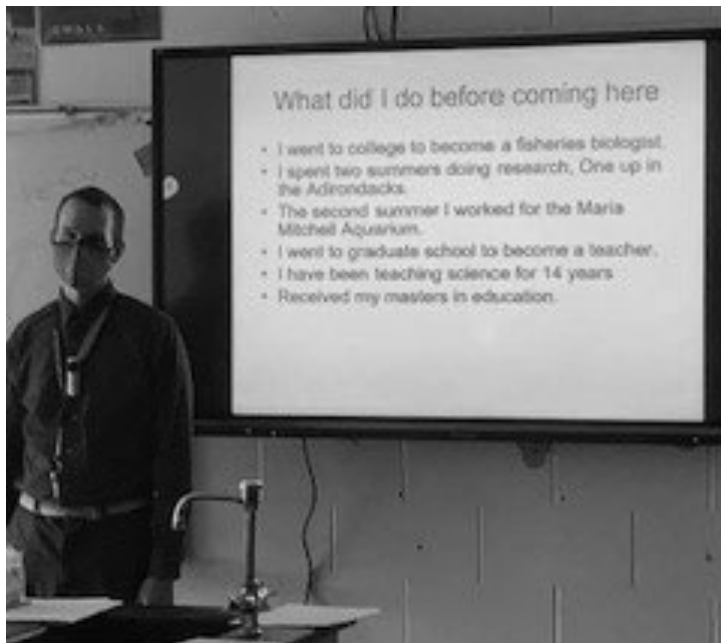


Office of Technology, Curriculum and Instruction -- On September 7, 2021 the Adirondack Central School district completed an extensive technology upgrade project where each and every instructional staff member's classroom was equipped with a new and vastly improved ViewSonic instructional "Smartboard". The Adirondack Central School district was granted "SmartSchools" funding to improve upon existing technology structures aimed at increasing student engagement. 116 ViewSonic Boards were installed over the course of the installation project along with 5 mobile trolley carts that can be utilized in various instructional spaces such as in gymnasiums, cafeterias, presentation rooms, and instructional support learning spaces.

Teachers and Instructional support staff were provided with two specialized training sessions before the beginning of the new school year. The first professional learning session was offered on August 23 and the second session was offered during our Superintendent's Conference Day on September 1, 2021. ViewSonic experts delivered both sessions from within our school district in order to directly support teachers, consult with teachers in their classrooms, troubleshoot software concerns, and answer any and all questions. The Viewsonic project was a major step forward for our entire learning community, and we will continue to capitalize on the lessons learned during our remote, hybrid, and in-person instructional models of last school year.
